Short-Term Programme 'Summit' 2022 Shaping the Future of STPs

6 – 7 May 2022 in Lucerne, Switzerland and online

Short-Term Programmes (STP) can be defined as "those in which students are engaged for fewer than eight weeks" ¹. Do you agree? What other criteria define short-term programmes? And how should STPs be designed to be a valuable and sustainable learning experience? Join us for an inspiring two-day 'summit' to discuss innovative models of short-term programmes in higher education.

The <u>Lucerne School of Business</u> of the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts, Switzerland and <u>VSE Prague University of Economics and Business</u>, Czech Republic, invite you to actively take part in a two-day Short-Term Programme 'Summit' if you are a:

- Representative of a partner university of VSE or LSoB, with experience in the area of STPs
- Representative of any other higher-education institution who would like to share their experiences of STPs with colleagues.

Short-term programmes are becoming more and more popular for various reasons: "They are generally more affordable than longer programs, they appeal to students who might not be able or willing to commit to a semester or a year abroad, and they allow students in structured academic programs (...) to study abroad without falling behind in their (degree) programs" (Donnelly-Smith, 2009). However, STPs are often associated with partying and vacations: "Published opinion has often discounted short-term programmes as little more than educational tourism with limited opportunities for deep cultural learning" (Potts, 2020^2).

We would like to engage in a discussion about what it takes to create valuable, sustainable short-term programmes which have a significant impact on the participants' academic, personal and professional development on the one hand, and enhance internationalisation@home in the host university on the other hand.

- Varieties of subject-related content
- Social programmes

- **Abstract**: short summary (ca. 300 words) of what you plan to present / work on
- Format: please see above
- **Publication:** let us know whether you are interested in publishing your findings together with others after the conference
- Contact details (of author and co-authors): name, address, email, telephone, name of your higher-education institution
